Exodus 19:3-8 (NLT)

³ Then Moses climbed the mountain to appear before God. The Lord called to him from the mountain and said, "Give these instructions to the family of Jacob; announce it to the descendants of Israel: ⁴ 'You have seen what I did to the Egyptians. 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1 Peter 2:9-12(NLT)
